- 1. Meeting called to order at 11:40 by Andy.

 - e. Approved spending \$500 on plaques for guest speakers. Approval by Steve, seconded by Heather. Approved by vote.
 - f. Approval to refund Pat Druckenmiller for his travel expenses for his lecture last month \$200.
 - g. No update on the laptops.
 - h. Need a slide to remind people to donate to the scholarship program before the talks.
 - i. Steve has a rough draft letter to send to the existing advertisers about rate changes.

j. Everyone needs to get in Webex and practice using it for the lectures. USGS wants us to use this for our lectures.

- d. Need to have e-mail addresses and password information for AGS committees sent to the board. Potentially have all committee members have access to the admin privileges.
- e. Committee is reviewing scholarships and scoring them. This information should be uploaded to the google drive. Committee will meet on Feb. 25th to approve the top candidates.
- f. Board needs to validate choices by March board meeting. Sue will then send these names to PSAAPG who will send the matching funds. Hopefully scholarship winners will be announced by the technical conference.
- g. One of the requirements for getting a scholarship from AGS is for them to send a paragraph a year later to say what they have accomplished with that scholarship money. This can then be put in the newsletter or they can be a guest lecturer for AGS luncheons.
- 9. Andy will go as the AAPG delegate in Ken's place for the meeting in Houston.
