Travis Hudson's passion for the geology of Alaska is exemplified by more than 50 years of research and 55 first-author papers and maps. His interests cover diverse topics: petrology of igneous rocks, especially the Mesozoic arcs of southern and southeastern Alaska; mineralization associated with intrusive rocks, such as tin granites of the Seward Peninsula; architecture and stratigraphy of major sedimentary basins in interior Alaska; and the integrated tectonic evolution of Alaska. Travis challenged paradigms and provoked discussion to clarify complex problems. He worked for the U.S. Geological Survey, Anaconda, ARCO, American Geosciences Institute, and independently. Over his long career, Travis has inspired many geologists with his field-based studies and deep knowledge of Alaska geology.
